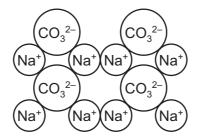

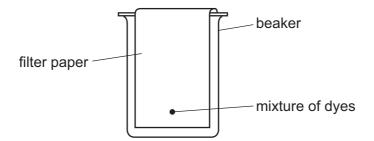

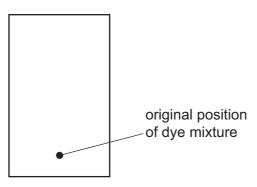
**3** A student used the apparatus shown below to separate a mixture of coloured dyes. The solvent is not shown.

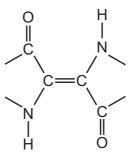

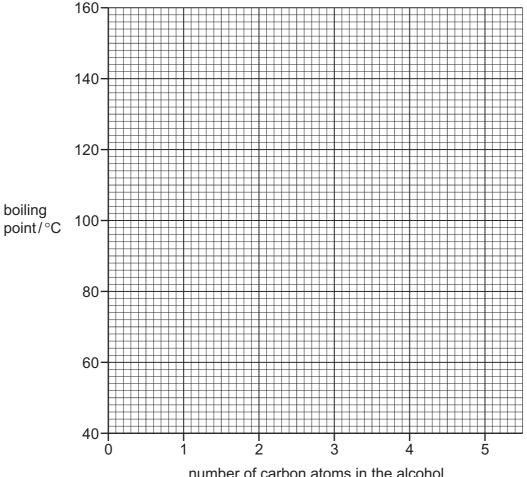

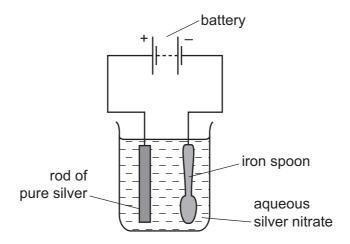
