- 1 Cuddles Ltd is a public limited company making and selling a range of prams and pushchairs. It sells to retail stores in its home country and online to individual customers all over the world.
 - (a) Identify **one** sector of production that Cuddles Ltd is concerned with. [1]
 - (b) Explain two advantages to Cuddles Ltd of being a public limited company. [4]
 - (c) Explain **one** difficulty Cuddles Ltd may have when selling online to individual customers all over the world. [2]
 - (d) (i) Explain the purposes of **two** commercial documents Cuddles Ltd would use when selling to retail stores in its home country. [4]
 - (ii) Why is it important for these retail stores to offer after-sales service on the prams and pushchairs sold? [3]
 - (e) Cuddles Ltd is considering selling to retail stores in other countries. Discuss whether or not it should do this. Give reasons for your opinion. [6]
- 2 Fairway Logistics is an international transport company based in South Africa. It has depots in Cape Town and Johannesburg.
 - (a) Fairway Logistics owns a bonded warehouse and takes part in the entrepôt trade.

- (b) Fairway Logistics uses the following methods of transport:



- (d) Explain two reasons why Fairway Logistics is unlikely to use rail transport. [4]

 - (i) Explain why biscuits need packaging.
 - (ii) A consumer purchased a packet of biscuits which was found to be out-of-date. State three actions the consumer might take. [3]
- 4 Salim, an employee of Sphi Ltd, was killed in an accident at work. Sphi Ltd's insurance company paid compensation of \$800000 to Salim's family. Salim also had life insurance cover totalling \$180000.
 - (a) (i) Name the type of insurance Sphi Ltd would have in order to provide insurance cover for its workers. [1]
 - (ii) Calculate the total amount of money Salim's family would receive. Show your working.

- (b) (i) State four stages in the process of making an insurance claim. [4]
 - (ii) Explain how the principle of indemnity applies when making an insurance claim. [3]
- (c) Salim's wife is a customer of the Orion Bank. Explain two ways in which the Orion Bank may assist her. [4]
- (d) Salim worked on the production line in the factory at Sphi Ltd. Discuss the advantages and disadvantages to factory workers of working on a production line. Are the advantages greater than the disadvantages for the factory workers? Give reasons for your answer. [6]

- (b) (i) Explain two benefits to Betsy's business of locating in the Archer Shopping Mall. [4]
 - (ii) Why would Betsy contact the owner of Suleiman Enterprises by telephone rather than email to arrange to see Unit 24? [3]
- (c) Betsy has decided to purchase the lease. She has \$20,000 but will need to borrow the rest of the money. Assess the sources of finance that might be available to Betsy. Which would you recommend? Give reasons for your answer.
- (d) Explain two ways, apart from moving to the Archer Shopping Mall, in which Betsy might try to improve the turnover of her shop. [4]

- 6 A European vehicle manufacturer has agreed a \$70 million export order to supply trucks to a road haulage company based in a country in Asia.
 - (a) Explain why rapid communication was important when negotiating this order. [4]
 - (b) Explain one way in which Customs Authorities would be involved in this order. [2]
 - (c) (i) Explain why distance is an important factor to consider when exporting goods such as trucks. [4]
 - (ii) Name **one other** factor that should be considered when exporting the trucks. [1]
 - (d) Explain how the \$70 million order would affect the Balance of Payments of the Asian country.

 - (ii) Why is Fizz Ltd likely to buy most of its stock directly from manufacturers? [4]
 - (iii) How does warehousing assist Fizz Ltd to maintain supplies to its shops? [2]
 - (b) Explain why Fizz Ltd accepts many different means of payment from customers. [4]
 - (c) Why do customers buying from stores, such as Fizz Ltd, require consumer protection? [3]
 - (d) Fizz Ltd sells through outlets located in town centres as well as online. Discuss whether or not Fizz Ltd should continue to sell in this way. Give reasons for your answer. [6]

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
