

A braided river channel



A simplified global pattern of pressure and winds



Relationship between climate and types of weathering



Age/sex pyramids for France, an MEDC in Europe, in 2005 and predicted for 2050







^{*}Diversity visa entry is for those nationalities which are under-represented in the USA


Urban population, by country, 2007 Fig. 5 for Question 6
